

DRESS CODE

Shirts: Shirts are to be collared and white, light blue or navy blue in color. They may be short-sleeved, long-sleeved, or a turtleneck. They must be tucked in at all times for grades 2 - 8. These are the only colors that will be permitted.

- Sweatshirts, sweaters, or hooded sweatshirts are to be navy blue or white (not cream) in color. They must be the appropriate size for the student and must come to the waist and not fall below mid thigh. They can have a small, no bigger in diameter than a quarter, manufacturer logo. Students are not to wear crop-style tops of any kind. The 8th grade will be provided with red sweatshirts that may be worn as an alternative to the navy blue.

Pants: Pants are to be navy blue uniform pants and the middle school students may also wear khaki-colored pants. These pants are not to be made of fleece, flannel, spandex, velour, or jersey knits. The pants are not to be made of a material that make the pants cling to the body. Appropriate pants are available at Meijer, JCPenney, Wal-Mart, and other department stores. Middle School students are not to wear cream colored or white pants. Pants are to be worn at the waist.

Shoes: Tennis shoes are to snugly fit the foot by either being tied or having velcro. Shoes worn on a given day are to match, meaning students are not to wear a white right shoe and a blue left shoe. Students are encouraged to wear tennis shoes at recess even if they wear dress shoes to school. Winter boots are to be removed upon arrival to school and the student is expected to change into tennis shoes for the school day.

Belts (for grades 2 – 8): Belts are to be brown or black. They are not to have any studding, or other colors. All belts are to have a buckle. If the pants/shorts/capris have belt loops then a belt must be worn. All belts must be worn in the belt loops. PreSchool through 1st grade may wear a belt if they choose but it is not required.

Shorts/Skortts/Skirts/Capris: Shorts/Skortts/Skirts/Capris are to be navy blue in color except the Junior High may also wear khaki-colored shorts/skortts/skirts/capris. The length is to be to the knee except for capris which should be below the knee. If a skirt is worn then shorts must be worn under it. Shorts/Skortts/Skirts/Capris are not to be made of fleece, flannel, spandex, velour, or jersey knits. Shorts/Skortts/Capris are allowed to be worn from the beginning of school through September 30th and again from the day after spring break until the end of the year. All shorts/skortts/skirts/capris are to be worn at the waist.

Jumpers: Girls may wear navy or plaid sleeveless jumpers knee length or below.

Hair:

- Boys: Hair is to be neatly trimmed. Hair in the back should be no more than ¼ inch below the hairline. Bangs should not fall below the eyebrows and the sides of the hair must be around the ear.
- Girls: Neat lady like hairstyles are appropriate. Bangs are to be out of the eyes.
- All Students: There are to be no extremes in hairstyles including color. The Principal reserves the right to determine if a hairstyle is considered to be “extreme”.

Makeup/Nail Polish/Jewelry/Facial Hair:

All Grades

- Absolutely no makeup is to be worn.
- Clear nail polish is permitted. Nothing of color.
- Girls may wear one post earring in each ear. No dangling or hoop earrings. Boys are not permitted to wear earrings of any kind.
- No spray bottles or perfume is to be brought into the school.
- A simple crucifix, cross, or religious medal or scapular may be worn by either boys or girls. No other type of neckwear is permitted.
- A wristwatch may be worn. No bracelets are to be worn of any kind.
- All male students are to be clean-shaven daily.

Alterations in Dress Code for Special Days:
Cargo Pants are not allowed.

Jeans Days (The ones you pay for):

- Students may wear jeans and a shirt of their choosing. No collars are required.
- The jeans must be free of holes, frayed edges, and be worn in the same fashion as school uniform pants.
- The shirts must not have any pictures or wording that can be considered offensive; this includes innuendo.
- No sleeveless shirts are to be worn.
- Shirts do not have to be tucked in but must be long enough that tucking them in is possible.
- Grades 2-8: If the pants have belt loops then a belt must be worn.

N.U.T. Card Jeans Days (The ones you earn):

- Students may wear jeans and a collared shirt of their choosing.
- The jeans must be free of holes, frayed edges, and be worn in the same fashion as school uniform pants.
- The shirts must not have any pictures or wording that can be considered offensive; this includes innuendo.
- No sleeveless shirts are to be worn.
- Shirts do not have to be tucked in but must be long enough that tucking them in is possible.
- Grades 2-8: If the pants have belt loops then a belt must be worn.

School Program Days:

- If the students are required to dress in a particular costume, such as all black, then they are to wear their school uniform to school and change for the program.
- If the students are asked to wear their "Sunday Best" then the following will apply:
 - ❖ Students may wear shoes that are appropriate for their outfit.
 - ❖ The student must bring tennis shoes to wear for recess.
 - ❖ Skirts and dresses must be of appropriate school uniform length.
 - ❖ Boys: Shirts must be tucked in.
 - ❖ No Cargo pants or Jeans

Picture Day:

- The only deviation from the accepted Dress Code described above will be that the student may wear a colored shirt or blouse.
- The shirt or blouse does not need to have a collar.
- Girls may wear dresses for pictures and then change into school uniforms or remain in dress clothes for the day.
Please note: The dresses must cover the entire shoulder.
- Boys: Shirts must be tucked in.
- Sleeveless shirts or blouses are allowed as long as the entire shoulder is covered.
- No Cargo pants or jeans.
